## INTECESSORY PRAYER

Pray whatever is on your heart to pray to God about. Perhaps these will help.

1. Ourselves
  - a. Pray for forgiveness -my sins against God; my trespasses against others
  - b. Pray for a new clean heart
  - c. Pray for a renewed mind
  - d. Pray for the filling of God's Holy Spirit within me
  - e. Pray to be a servant to be used by God for the upbuilding of His earthly kingdom
  - f. Pray to worship and praise God for who He is
  - g. Pray for more fruit – love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance
  - h. Pray for strength to trust God more
2. Our Church Councils. Your church may be a part of the United Council of Christian Community Churches, or it may be part of the Methodist, Baptist, AME, Presbyterian conferences, etc.
  - a. Pray for the leadership – their needs as leaders to be effective
  - b. Pray for unity
  - c. Pray that it continues to follow the doctrine of God and Christ
  - d. Pray for fellowship
3. Our Individual Churches
  - a. Pray for our leaders – what they need to be effective leaders
  - b. Pray for the individual needs of each member
  - c. See b, c, and d in number 1
4. Our Families, Friends, and Those Whom We Don't Know
  - a. Pray for our relationship with God
  - b. Pray for our relationship with each other
  - c. Pray for our daily need to be met
  - d. Pray over the demonic forces to break strongholds (depression, suicidal thoughts, jealousy, to name a few)
  - e. Pray over our Finances – to put God first, to meet financial obligations, to help those in need
  - f. Pray about how thankful we are and what we are thankful for
  - g. Pray for the needs of our school systems
5. Our Country, Our World
  - a. Pray for our local, state, and national government leaders
  - b. Pray for the ongoing wars
  - c. Pray for the families of the innocent lives lost
  - d. Pray for those who don't know the Lord or have a personal relationship with Him
  - e. Pray for the injustices we face in the United States and in other countries
    - i. Racism
    - ii. Sexism
    - iii. False/unfair incarcerations
  - f. Pray that we share about God's faithfulness to us even amid the injustices and trials we continue to see and experience.
  - g. Pray for safety from the viruses that have plagued us recently

This is in no way an exhaustive list, but hopefully it gives a place to start in your prayer to the Almighty. Just have a sincere conversation with God and let Him know what is on your heart.
